Corey Laramore, Coordinator of Student Health and Safety

Safety and Security measures

Corey shared some of his background including that he was previously the Dean of Students in a Trenton school district and that he is an author of a dual language book, "It's all about you!".

Some of the topics covered:

- Princeton has its own identity.
- Lanyards and IDs would like them linked to PowerSchool and attendance to help with fire drills etc. A future enhancement perhaps.
- Corey meets with the safety team at each school with the district.
- Communication parents and students like real time updates on what is happening. But the
 update can change so this can create anxiety. Therefore, the team waits for confirmed
 information before providing it to staff, students and parents.
- · Wearing IDs helps with safety and security.
- Free period want kids in particular locations rather than roaming the hallways. Looking at implementing this for next year.

Questions/comments from parents included:

- What are your thoughts on metal detectors?
- Could Walnut be made a bus lane so the school becomes a 'campus' this would involve town planning.
- School violence among students is more of an issue rather than external threats. Other schools in the area have Class Three Special Law Enforcement Officer (SLEO). Parents, staff and students have to be involved with any changes.
- Any thought to implementing a corporate like scan of IDs when students come into school?
- Is there a way to check who you are before you are let into the school? This exists at other schools.

Dr. Joy Barnes Johnson, Science Supervisor 6 -12

Dr. Joy Barnes Johnson is the Supervisor 6-12 for science. Trying to reimagine post pandemic what the curriculum should be and connect middle school to high school.

Here are the notes that she would like to share from the PTO meeting:

- Testing season is upon us! The NJ Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA) for 11th graders is a state mandated assessment that must be passed in order to graduate. Testing at PHS will begin March 13th.
- Vision for STEM engagement is interdisciplinarity. We are excited that the teaching kitchens at PMS will re-open to the Cooks & Gardens club for middle schoolers. Thanks to the Princeton School Gardens Cooperative, we are looking forward to reviving programs that teach students about healthy eating and garden-to-plate living. That program starts on March 14th.
- We are hoping to stock every kitchen for the programs. This level of investment will hopefully
 make room for us to use the kitchen as a lab environment across the district. We will be
 piloting programs with a new position: Food Systems Literacy Coordinator. This will allow us
 to imagine new ways to fulfill our promise of preparing all students to lead lives of joy and
 purpose as knowledgeable and skilled citizens of a global society—with think food is the
 perfect place to start.
- Our M.A.P.P.ing vision is designed to help us place every student appropriately and
 according to their passions. We aspire to fulfill Dr. Kelley's promise outlined in Focus Forward
 and engage every student in authentic research by the time they graduate that presents
 sound understanding and promotes creativity, innovation, collaboration and celebrates our
