

This Week's Sustainability Tip: Avoiding Fast Fashion

Teenagers may enjoy fast fashion because it's an inexpensive way to keep up with latest trends, but it takes an incredible toll on the environment and on the people who make it. Read about why fast fashion is harmful to the environment, and encourage your students to follow these easy steps to be sustainably fashionable.

- **Did you know that the average American throws away around 65 pounds** of clothing/year? That totals around 12.8 million tons of clothing which is equivalent to a football field filled 14 feet deep with clothes that sit rotting in landfills leaching toxic chemicals and dyes into local soil and groundwater.
- The fashion industry is said to be the second dirtiest in the world (the oil industry is first), and its CO2 emissions are projected to increase by more than 60% to nearly 2.8 billion tons per year by 2030.
- Cheap fashions are generally made by underage workers who earn less than \$3/day working an average of 14 hours/day in sweatshops. The majority of these workers are girls and young women.

- Cotton is a demanding crop which can require 20,000 liters of water to produce just one t-shirt or pair of jeans. Most cotton is grown on irrigated land which can threaten water security in some areas. Although a mere 2.4% of cropland cultivates cotton, it accounts for 24% and 11% of the world's pesticide and insecticide use respectively. In addition, the dying process is both energy and very chemically intensive. Discharge water contaminated with chemicals from the dying process threatens waterways and fresh water supplies.
- There are many easy and inexpensive ways to be fashionable without the environmental and human toll that fast fashion takes. Consider these easy options:
 - Shop at consignment stores where you'll find unusual and unique fashions at a fraction of the cost of retail. In Princeton, we have the Nearly New Shop, Greene Street, and Princeton Consignment.
 - Consider hosting a clothing swap with friends.
 - There are numerous online sites where you can buy gently used clothing, and sell your own, as well.
 - Consider buying organic cotton clothing or items made with recycled content. Sustainable fashion is becoming more common, with retailers like H&M and Patagonia leading the way.
 - Consider buying fewer items that are better made and which will last longer.
 - When you're ready to clean out your closet, donate items to charity, consign them to local shops, host a swap meet with friends, or sell them online or at a yard sale. Unwearable clothing can be donated to Pick Up Please.

What You Need to Know About the NJ Bag Ban

When the New Jersey <u>bag ban</u> goes into effect on May 4, it will likely be the strictest in the nation. The bill, originally signed back in November 2020, bans all single-use bags at grocery stores and limits the types of bags non-grocery stores can use. Here is what you need to know about the law:

What about paper bags?

Non-grocery and retail stores can still provide paper bags, but large grocery stores over 2,500 square feet cannot provide paper or plastic bags. For reference, a trade publication says most grocery stores are between <u>12,00 and 40,000 square feet</u>.

What do I do when I go to the grocery store?

Bring your own bags (reusable or single-use), be prepared to buy a reusable one at the register, or carry out your purchase without a bag. Stores cannot require customers to purchase a reusable bag.

What qualifies as a reusable bag?

To be considered reusable, the bag must have handles, be made of some kind of washable fabric, and withstand 125 uses and multiple washes. Anything made of plastic,

regardless of thickness, is not considered reusable. Bags with glued-on handles also don't qualify as reusable.

Do other states also ban paper bags?

No, New Jersey's bag ban is unique in its restriction on paper bags.

Will this affect shop from home grocery orders?

It's a little unclear how major retailers are planning to handle shop from home orders once the ban goes into effect. A state Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) spokesperson confirmed that these types of orders are not exempt from the rules.

What are the exceptions to the plastic bag ban?

According to the DEP, the exceptions are:

- A bag used solely to contain or wrap uncooked meat, fish, or poultry.
- A bag used solely to package loose items such as fruits, vegetables, nuts, coffee, grains, baked goods, candy, greeting cards, flowers, bulk food, or small hardware items.
- A bag used solely to contain live animals, such as fish or insects sold in a pet store.
- A bag used solely to contain food sliced or prepared to order, including soup or hot food.
- A laundry, dry cleaning, or garment bag.
- A bag provided by a pharmacy to carry prescription drugs.
- A bag for newspapers.
- Any similar bag, as determined by the DEP pursuant to rule, regulation, or guidance.

What is polystyrene, and how does that part of the ban impact consumers?

Polystyrene, a plastic used to make food containers, comes in two forms: hard plastic like the condiment containers used by delis, and foam, which is generally associated with the term Styrofoam. Containers made using foam polystyrene will be be banned, while the hard version will not be included.

Through May 2024, long soda spoons used for thick milk-shake type drinks, 2-ounce portion cups when used for hot foods or "foods requiring lids," trays for raw meat or fish, and pre-packaged food that comes in that type of packaging will still be allowed.

What about straws?

There is no statewide ban on single-use plastic straws, but as of November 2021, restaurants can only provide one if the customer specifically asks for it. Food service businesses are required to keep a supply of plastic straws on hand, something disability advocates have pushed for when similar straw bans have gone into effect elsewhere.

If you're not used to bringing your own bags to the store, you can prepare in advance for the ban by taking four simple steps:

Step 1: Start gathering enough reusable bags to accommodate your weekly grocery shopping or other large shopping trips.

Step 2: Hang your bags by your door, or put them in your car, where you are likely to remember them. Writing "BAGS" at the top of your shopping list is another effective memory trick.

Step 3: Keep a lightweight, foldable bag in your purse, backpack, or pocket in case of unexpected errands.

Step 4: Don't wait until May 4; start shopping with reusable bags now. Some stores even provide a small refund when you use your own bags.


