

This Week's Sustainability Tip: Gardening with Native Plants

With Spring just around the corner, it's the perfect time to plan what type of garden you'll plant this year. As you consider options, one eco-friendly technique should always be on your to-do list: utilizing native plants.

What are native plants? Native plants are species that grow in a region without human introduction. Only plants found in NJ before European settlement are considered to be native here. The Native Plant Society of NJ has identified over 2,000 native plant species

in our state; the Flora of NJ Project is gathering information and creating a database about our native plants.

Top Benefits of Native Plants

- Hardy, low-maintenance native plants save time and money. Well-adapted to local
 climate and soil, native plants have natural defenses to plant diseases, harmful
 insects, and other pests. Plant the right native in the right place, and it will thrive
 with minimal care. Once established, native plants flourish with normal rainfall and
 need little additional watering. Native plants grow well with minimal fertilization;
 they're less likely to develop pest problems requiring treatment.
- Native plants attract and support wildlife. If you enjoy watching birds, butterflies, and other wildlife, native plants will bring them into your yard. Because native animals evolved together with native plants, they depend on them for essential food, shelter, and nesting sites. Plant a variety to provide year-round sources of food and diverse types of cover for wildlife.
- Native plants improve water quality. Native plant roots help prevent erosion by holding soil in place, increase infiltration of rainwater into the ground, and filter pollutants like lawn chemicals from the water. Since native plants lessen the need to apply fertilizers and pesticides, they keep our water cleaner and healthier by reducing the amount of pollution that rainwater runoff can carry into our waterways.
- Native plants work in all garden designs. When considering native plants, think
 about more than just wildflower meadows. There are choices perfect for
 foundation beds, shrub borders, specimen trees, ground covers, water gardens,
 woodland edges, and more. No matter what your garden style, you can find a
 variety of beautiful native plants for your yard.

- Learn about natives. The Native Plant Society of NJ maintains a list of native
 plants by county. More information can be found on the NJ Agricultural Experiment
 Station website. Use an app like iNaturalist to help you identify all kinds of flora
 and fauna.
- 2. **Stop buying invasives**. Be sure to check the "Do Not Plant" list found on the Friends of Hopewell Valley Open Space (FOHVOS) website.
- 3. Remove invasives. The FOHVOS Invasive Species Strike Team maintains a list of invasive species and recommended methods to eradicate them on your property.

The D&R Greenway Land Trust, Bowman's Hill Wildflower Preserve, and Toadshade Wildflower Farm each offer periodic native plant sales. 
