> This Week's Sustainability Tip: Greening the Holidays

December is a magical time of year with all of its festive celebrations. However, American households generate an additional one million tons of trash between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day. It takes just a few changes to make the holidays sustainable, as well as festive. Here are a few easy ways to make a difference during your holiday celebrations.

- If you hang lights, consider using LEDs as opposed to standard bulbs. They save 95 percent of energy overtime. Don't forget to set a timer to turn the lights off when you go to bed (or turn them off by hand).
- Check Earth911.com for places that accept non-working light strands for recycling.
- Consider giving edible gifts such as breads, cookies, preserves, dried fruits, nut mixes, or herbed vinegars in reusable containers.
- Consider giving gifts of nature such as ceremonial adoptions of animals or tree purchases. Many groups provide these type of gifting opportunities. Locally, the Friends of Princeton Open Space offer the chance to donate trees for their reforestation project: <u>https://www.fopos.org/forest-restoration-project-3</u>
- Make sure to recycle boxes received for online shopping (or reuse them for sending gifts). Once deflated, the plastic cushioning inserts can be recycled at stores such as McCaffrey's, Whole Foods, and Shop Rite.
- Save wrapping paper for next year or make sure to recycle it (do not recycle plastic or metallic wrap). Re-use ribbon and bows.





Free Vaccination Clinic on Tuesday, Dec. 21, for all PPS Families

PPS and the Princeton Department of Health are sponsoring a free vaccination clinic from 4-8 PM on Tuesday, Dec. 21, at 45 Stockton Street, near Monument Hall. To sign up for a vaccination or a booster shot, please use <u>this link</u>

- The Pfizer vaccination will be available for students ages 5 to 11. If students received their first vaccination on Nov. 30, they can receive the second vaccination on Dec. 21.
- Pfizer vaccinations will also be available for students ages 12-18.
- Vaccinations for adults, including booster shots, will be available.
- If you have signed up your student, ages 5 to 11, for a vaccination, they will receive Pfizer/Pediatric Pfizer, which is the only brand authorized for minors.
- Please upload your vaccination card (see instructions below) after your child has received both shots.
- Boosters will be offered to anyone who is eligible. (Those who have had Pfizer or Moderna are eligible for a booster dose 6 months after their second dose. Those who received J & J are eligible 2 months after their initial vaccination.)
- Please remember that you or your child are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after the 2nd vaccine.

Once your child is fully vaccinated, please follow the directions below if you wish to share their status with the schools to allow for more efficient contact tracing.

Vaccination Card Upload Instructions

To keep students safe and to facilitate contact tracing, we ask that parents upload their student's vaccination card into our existing Student Information System, PowerSchool after the student's second shot.

- Contact tracing requires PPS nurses to inquire about each student's vaccination status.
- If a student is named a "close contact," the student will not need to quarantine or miss school if they are in fact vaccinated.

PPS will maintain student confidentiality. Only staff directly involved in contact tracing will have access to vaccination status. Please see the directions below which are provided in both English and Spanish.
